### Scholarship Information

#### Derek J. Lohmeyer Memorial Scholarship-\$500

- Must have a 'B' or better in NMSC Program
- College/Technical Training for classes, training courses, book and/or tools necessary for the trade

#### New Market Foundation Breakfast Scholarship-\$500

- Two scholarships available
- 1 scholarship to be used for tuition for College or Technical Training for a student to pursue their education at an accredited public college or private vocational school
- 1 scholarship for "Tools of the Trade" to purchase equipment necessary to further education or training through an apprenticeship, university, or community college

#### Norma L. Loree Memorial Scholarship-\$1000

- Must have one year of 540 hours in training program
- For tuition or expenses for a student who desires to pursue a further education at an accredited public college or private vocational school

#### Orm & Beth Vertrees Memorial Scholarship-\$500

- Tuition for College or Technical Training for NMSC student who plans to attend technical training at a State of Washington university, college, community college
- Scholarship is valid for two years from award date

### Scholarship Information

#### Delbert & Lettie Roberts Memorial Scholarship-\$500

- Must have 540 hours at NMSC
- For a student who plans to attend a college, community college, or technical training facility
- Scholarship is valid for two years from award date

#### Sodexo (Culinary Arts) Scholarship

- Culinary Arts students only
- For Tuition only

#### Direct Entry Try A Trade Scholarship-\$700

- Scholarship to be used for purchase of necessary tools in the Construction Trade apprenticeship program

#### SPSCC Academic Excellence Scholarship

- Two-year tuition only scholarship is for three quarters of full time attendance in each academic year
- Required to maintain a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA
- Demonstrate high probability of success in college at SPSCC
- Once student accesses scholarship, the two-year time frame begins

#### Construction Trades Try A Trade Scholarship-\$500 & \$1000

#### NMSC Student of the Year Scholarship-\$1000

- Student must have been a previous Student of the Month Award recipient for 2016-17 school year
- Student must be in good standing at NMSC with professionalism, employability and a grade of 'B' or better

Student will be chosen on scholastic achievement, leadership, and an additional written essay of approximately 300 words that indicates how the money will benefit the student's education
- Scholarship 2-Used for uniforms and/or equipment for career and technical training costs; not based primarily on financial hardship; will be chosen on scholastic achievement, leadership, and an additional written essay of approximately 300 words that indicates how the money will benefit the student's career.
- 2 scholarships are awarded to a student from any NMSC program
- Scholarship 3-Tuition and/or fees for post secondary education; paid to school of student's choice; must be used by the fall quarter of the year following graduation from NM; not based primarily on financial hardship. Student will be chosen on scholastic achievement, leadership, and an additional written essay of approximately 300 words that indicates how the money will benefit the student's education.
